Street Massacre in Crest Hill

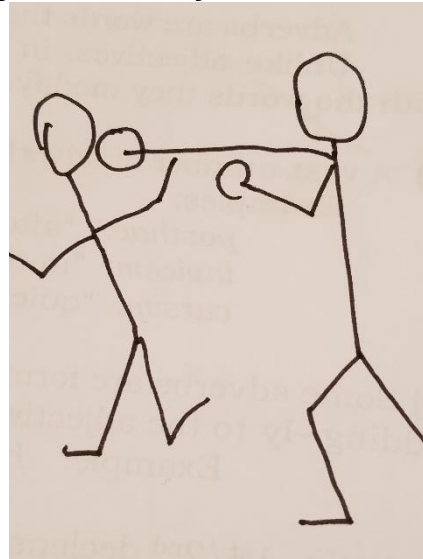

Gangster Killed in Robbery
